Minutes of Meeting

Call to Order and Introduction of Executive; Judy Hall

- 1) Minutes of Previous Meeting June 23, 2007 read aloud by Judy Hall
- 2) Financial Report Pat Jones
 - As of June 28, 2007 = \$3,895.06
 - Income from 50/50 draw = \$10.00
 - Membership \$1,790.00 = 118 members to date 2007
 - Bank interest .32.
 - expenses 1.90 bank charges
 - total 5693.48

2) Introduction of Guest Speakers – Judy Hall

- a) Water Quality Technician, Mississippi Valley Conservation Authority Susan Lee; report on water testing done in 2006 as follows;
 - conducted testing summer of 2006; sampled at deepest point near west basin

Study findings as follows;

- phosphorus key nutrient for plant growth -originates from detergents, septic, run offs and `pesticides/fertilizers
 - results: 7.6 micrograms of phosphorus per litre of water which is great lake results.
- chlorophyll <u>a</u>; green pigment average 2.9 micrograms of chlorophyll <u>a</u> per litre of water indicating moderate rating which is excellent
- invasive species; test show we didn't have spiny water fleas, however, we do have zebra mussels veligers (larvae)

Recommendations for lakeshore residents:

- build 30 meters away from shoreline
- plant vegetation
- pump septic every 3 years at least
- reduce water usage and use phosphate free detergents
- never use herbicides, pesticides or fertilizers

Our lake association was adopted by Omya in 2006 and because of their donation, we were able to test the lake 8 times.

- **b)** Police Services Board Derek Love(member) what services does the board provide in the township
 - Derek is the Chair of the "Cottage Watch" on White Lake;
 - In total, there are 7 Police Service Boards in Lanark County, each containing 3 members.
 - ATV's is a political issue which the Police Services Board is not involved. The law does state that ATVs are not allowed on any highway in Lanark County.
 - OPP Boats presence on the water; zero tolerance for alcohol in boats. If we want the OPP boat present on the Lake, then we should call and ask for one.

c) Uranium Mining

- John Kittle possible effects of proposed uranium mining to the Mississippi watershed;
 - Uranium Deposits are near Crotch Lake. 30 thousand acres have been staked to date.

- John is a scientist (nuclear and physics) who has settled in Lanark Highlands with his family about a year ago.
- John voiced great concern about the proposed uranium mining and is passionate in fighting the threat.
- If a spill occurred, it could pollute the Mississippi watershed. Even if a spill doesn't occur, the dust alone is a potential cancer threat.
- Why mine now? Price for uranium is extremely high. Nuclear power is in demand. John is
 presently preparing a letter to premier McGuinty requesting an immediate moratorium on
 uranium exporation.

- Exploration

- 100 claims have been staked over 30 acres.
- The Mining Act allows mining without notifying property owners that do not hold the mineral rights.
- No requirement exists in the mining act to notify or even consult property owners. Literally they can remove material with 24hrs notice to property owners.
- The Mining companies don't need environmental assessments, nor do they have to clean up after exploration.
- Property owners could be sued if anyone gets hurt in the process of mining

Mines;

- Bancroft has been opened
- hwy 7 near Marmora; Deloro site is a toxic site

Health Risks

- Cancerous health hazards by exposure to uranium mining which is a radioactive material.

Concerns;

- Ontario mining act is 150 years old.

John's Recommendations;

- Get informed, write to the government representatives to stop mining, get involved, show your support, and sign the petition.
